Say Hello to Carolyn Rand

Carolyn Rand's life comes down to two teachings her parents instilled in their children:

1. "To be fully alive is to work for the common good," and

2. "No definition of success is complete without service to others."

After a career in health services that began in social work for Montgomery County and ended

after 20 years with CareFirst BlueCrossBlueShield where she consistently delivered top sales numbers - Carolyn focuses on her two passions: golf and volunteering. She's even combined the two!

An avid golfer who spends part of the year golfing in Palm City, Florida, Carolyn captains the Challenge Club golf team at the Congressional Golf Club, where she was one of the first women invited to join without a legacy sponsorship.

"Golf maintains athletic abilities and the competitiveness keeps the mind sharp," she says. (Scoring par for five holes during a recent tournament underscores this.)

Carolyn served as a volunteer coordinator for Congressional's Junior Golf for seven years and was vice president for the club's Women's Golf Association, introducing area youth and other women to the game. Carolyn has also been a District of Columbia Golf Association member since 2013.

Her volunteer interests don't stop at the 18th (or 19th) hole. She was a volunteer docent at Hillwood Mansion and Gardens - one of Charter 100 DC's favorite places! - for five years. She shared her Medicare expertise as an Open Enrollment speaker for 4Cs Church Alliance and served as president of the Women's Board of the Montgomery County Heart Association.

During the height of the COVID epidemic from 2020 to 2022, Carolyn volunteered for the Cleveland Clinic GoPink Committee's Breast Navigator Program in Martin County, Florida. (October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month.)

Last year, Carolyn began volunteering with the Equine Rescue and Adoption Foundation in Palm City, spearheading a collection to help horse owners in financial distress buy food for their horses. "We were able to keep horses with their owners, in their familiar surroundings, at a time when many owners had lost their jobs," she says. "It was a win-win-win for owners, horses, and horse sanctuaries nearing capacity."

"Charter 100 DC is a place where women can socialize, hear interesting speakers, and come together over common interests," Carolyn says. "I've already met new and fascinating women at the September lunch and other events," she says, adding that she looks forward to hearing about how other members continue to broaden their perspectives and goodwill.
